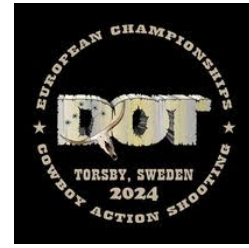


Swedish rules about gunhandling for Buckaroos/Bucarettes, Junior Girl and Junior Boy



The young shooters must be mature and physically strong enough to carry and handle their firearms in a safe manner.

The young shooters guardian (an active shooter + RO1 certified) and their club manager decides in consultation whether he/she qualifies to participate in Cowboy Action Shooting matches. The club manager has the final right to decide on the matter.

A permission for the young shooter signed by his/her guardian and the board of his/her club is required. For Indian Attack/DOT2024 this permission must be presented at the registration on the range.

The guardian always bears the ultimate responsibility for the young shooter. The young shooter and guardian/responsible must have undergone RO1 training.

Buckaroos and Bucarettes 11-13 years old.

According to the Swedish Western Shooters federation(SWSf), shooters must be at least 11 years old to participate in Cowboy Action Shooting. Furthermore, Air/Co2 revolvers MUST be used by Bucaroos and Bucarette.

Indian Attack and DOT 2024 will provide 2 Air/Co2 revolvers for all Bucaroos/Bucarettes to share, free of charge. This includes ammunition. Bring your own holster.

For rifle and shotgun, Bucaroos and Bucarettes shoot powder loaded ammunition. We encourage reduction of the power factor of both, in particular the shotgun ammunition. Removal of the lead in the shotgun shells and just shooting the wads is allowed. Rifle ammunition must be of sufficient factor to avoid squibbs.

Junior Girl and Junior Boy 14-16 years:

Junior Girls and Junior Boys compete with standard revolvers in any caliber approved by SASS. However, it is important to adapt the factor of their ammunition to the shooter's ability.
